THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

All who seek a deeper life in Christ are welcome to receive Holy Communion by moving forward to the altar rail, to the side altar at the left (no stairs), or by remaining in your place and indicating to an usher that you would like to receive. Alternatively, you are welcome to receive a blessing, indicated by crossing your arms over your chest. If you are not yet baptized and feel drawn to receive Holy Communion, please speak with a priest about baptism after the service. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request.
